ARTIST STATEMENT

In my work, I often use analogue photographic techniques to slow down both the creation and viewing processes; this imbues the work with an aura of time, different to 'snapping a pic' digitally. This *slowing down* is part of an ontological approach, using photography to examine the human experience in relation to simple yet profound universal phenomena: the observation of being in space and time.

Rather than being a 'pencil of nature', or an apparatus for the representation of the 'real', in my work photography is considered in terms of the complex effects it has on perception and visuality, and for its ability to represent time.

BIOGRAPHY

Luke Parker received a BA (Communications) from the University of Technology in 1996, majoring in film and sound. Since then, his work as an artist has been included in exhibitions at the Art Gallery of New South Wales, the National Gallery of Victoria, Geelong Gallery, Gertrude Contemporary, the Centre for Contemporary Photography, Monash Gallery of Art, Carriageworks, Artspace, the National Art School Gallery, Campbelltown Arts Centre, Murray Art Museum Albury, and Penrith Regional Gallery. He has made works for many artist-run galleries, including for 55 Sydenham Road Marrickville, a project space where he was also a member of the artist board from 2015–18.
